Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

1) Inquiries about the application process.

2) Inquiries about your application status.

You can check your application status using your online profile. Click here to access your online profile <u>https://www.apegsservices.ca/apegs_Web/forms/cst/APEGS/login.aspx</u>. Your user name is your 5-digit file number or registration number and if you have not used the system before, you can obtain your password by clicking on "New password / Forgot password". Enter the information requested and an email containing your password will be sent to the preferred e-mail address on record with APEGS. It may take up to one month for your profile to be updated once we have received your document(s).

3) Inquiries about whether documents have been received.

See number 2 above.

4) Inquiries about NOC codes and SINP procedures.

For these questions please call SINP at **306-798-7467** or email <u>immigration@gov.sk.ca</u>. We are not affiliated with SINP. For your self-assessment choose the discipline that is closest to your bachelor degree. It does not matter what NOC code you are applying to SINP under.

5) Inquiries about the qualifications required to apply as an engineer-in-training.

The following are acceptable as the minimum level for an application to proceed to the next step of a detailed academic assessment:

- WES assessment is equivalent to 4 years of study at a bachelor level in Canada and is in an engineering or closely related discipline;
- WES assessment is equivalent to 3 years of study at a bachelor level in Canada and is in an engineering or closely related discipline;
- WES assessment is equivalent level to a Canadian 2 or 3 year post-secondary diploma, but the original title of the degree indicates a university level education, and the degree is in engineering or a closely related discipline;
- WES assessment is equivalent to three of four years of study at a bachelor level and the degree is in science (not engineering), plus a graduate degree (Masters of Ph.D.) in engineering;
- Canadian bachelor degree in math or science (not engineering) and graduate degree in engineering.

The following are not acceptable:

- o 2 or 3 year technology diploma from a Canadian institution.
- WES assessment is equivalent level to a Canadian 2 or 3 year post-secondary diploma, and the original degree title indicates a technology level education, not a university level education.
- Canadian bachelor degree in math or science with no additional university education in engineering.

If you have already applied and your education is in one of these categories you may withdraw your application and request a refund of your application fee.
